## The Sunday of the Word of God A Scriptural Reflection

### **Fulfilling Statements**

The Gospel of Matthew was prepared for Jews who had converted to Christianity in the early church. Therefore, much of Matthew's Gospel connects with prophecies found in readings from the Hebrew scriptures. Many of these prophecies foretold the suffering, doom, and demise of the Israelites, an often recalcitrant nation. But sometimes the prophecies pointed the people to a new vision, a new hope. It is this type of hopeful prophecy found in Isaiah today. At the time of Isaiah's words (in the mid-eighth century B.C.) the Israelites were in the grip of darkness resulting from an Assyrian conquest. The Jewish leaders had rejected Isaiah's plea for courage and faith in God. Instead they followed the pagan Assyrians. It was during this time that Isaiah foretold the coming of a Savior. The hope that Isaiah offered the people was the light brought to them by God, in the promise of the Messiah.

### **Following Jesus . . . The New Light**

Matthew makes a deliberate connection between the light that shines in the darkness and Jesus, the new light that will show us the way. The Gospel author uses the reading from Isaiah to connect the people of his community to their earlier tradition so that they could walk with Jesus Christ, the new light, the new hope.

There was something urgent in the story that Matthew put down for the people. As he described the call of the first disciples, they left their nets, their boats, and their families at the summons of Jesus. Two thousand years later, we still hear the invitation and our hearts are stirred to drop all the distractions of our lives and follow Jesus. The call of Jesus leads us to a vocation. We may choose a religious life or a single life, or we may be called to marriage, but it is the way in which we live out our response that brings us out of the darkness and allows us to walk in the light.

## LIVING STEWARDSHIP NOW

### What Would You Do If You Heard Jesus Calling You? How Would You Respond?

People do respond to him in different ways, you know. The rich young ruler went away sorrowful, because Jesus asked him to give up his riches (Mt 19:22). Urged on by the religious leaders, the Jerusalem mob demanded, "Let him be crucified!" (Mt 27:22-23).

On the other hand, as we read in Matthew 4, some responded affirmatively, even enthusiastically. Jesus invited two sets of brothers, Simon (whom we know as Peter) and Andrew and then James and John to follow him, and they did so.

Several aspects of this call and their responses should be noted. First, Jesus had just begun his ministry of preaching. The message, as Matthew records it, was "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." That was the same message preached by St. John the Baptist, but on Jesus' lips it had richer content, for the kingdom was being inaugurated by Jesus' own life, death, and resurrection. As Matthew comments, Jesus was fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah, "The people who sit in darkness have seen a great light" (Mt 4:16; cf. Is 9:1), and Christ himself is the light.

The second point to note is that Simon and Andrew followed Jesus "at once." The sons of Zebedee, James and John, went with Jesus "immediately." They did not delay until some more convenient time or insist on taking some time to think it over.

But all too often we put off our acceptance to a later date. Unlike those four first apostles, we don't follow immediately. We claim we'll follow when our family members are on their own, or when the business is flourishing, or when we've retired. But those times never seem to arrive, so we put off accepting Jesus' call indefinitely. It is possible to put the kingdom of heaven at the center of our lives without forsaking responsibilities to others.

So let us listen to Jesus' call to become his disciples. And when we hear that call, let us at once without delay follow him in the path he has set forth for us. We can find a rich and satisfying life as stewards using our talents and experiences for serving God's kingdom.

## Ordinary Time: Winter A Sense of the Season

What do the words Ordinary Time mean? Dorothy Day said, "The words 'Ordinary Time' in our prayer books put me in a state of confusion and irritation. To me, no time is ordinary." She was right. The Ordinary in Ordinary Time refers to ordinal—counted—time, not to a lack of something to celebrate. The Roman document, General Norms for the Liturgical Year and Calendar, says: "Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character [Advent, Christmastime, Lent, Triduum and Eastertime], 33 or 34 weeks remain in the yearly cycle that do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on the Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects." (#43)

How do we celebrate "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects"? We gather every Sunday. Sunday is our original feast day. Christians have gathered every Sunday—the day of Christ's resurrection, the first day of the week—ever since there were Christians.

Each year there are two blocks of Ordinary Time, one in the winter between Christmastime and Lent, and the other in summer and fall, from Pentecost through Christ the King. When we gather on Sundays in Ordinary Time, as always, we hear the scriptures proclaimed. We systematically read through the gospels. The first readings from the first testament of the Bible were chosen for their relationship to the gospel passages. The second readings come from the various letters of the second testament of the Bible. The mystery of Christ "in all its aspects" unfolds.

What is the heart of our Sunday celebration? We do our eucharist; that is, we do our thanksgiving. We praise and thank God for all creation; we pray for the whole world, as we remember Christ's life, death and resurrection. We share the bread and wine, the body and blood. We are sent forth to be the body and blood of Christ in our homes, our workplaces, our neighborhoods, our towns, our cities, our country, our world.

"What happens in our churches every Sunday is the fruit of our week. What happens as the fruit of the week past is the beginning of the week to come. Sunday is simultaneously a point of arrival and departure for Christians on their way to the fullness of the kingdom. This is not ordinary at all. This is the fabric of Christian living." (Saint Andrew Bible Missal [Brooklyn: William J. Hirten Co., 1982.]
