PENTECOST SUNDAY A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

Sighs allow us to sit there for a moment or two without breathing—just being there at peace and without whatever it is that we just exhaled, without our worry or our confusion or maybe even our inner pain. It's almost as if a sigh is a prayer for new spirit. On the other hand, hiccups are almost like breathing with potholes and speed bumps, like gulps of roughage to keep the good air flowing—or maybe they're gulps of spirit to get the body into balance when it's quite content to stay out of balance, a kind of forced prayer.

Lately I've been thinking about sighing and hiccupping. Maybe it's because I've grown older and sigh more often. Now when I sigh, I find myself deciding to live with life the way it is and saying to myself that it's got to be okay, because like it or not, it's all I've got. I've begun to realize that after fighting with some of my sins for sixty-some years without much ever seeming to change, maybe I just need to let God do whatever God is going to do. And so the Spirit sighs, which is another way of saying, "Jesus is Lord."

On the other hand, after sixty-plus years of living, I also keep discovering new sinfulness in my life, little corners that I've allowed to get dusty by staying out of them. Like greed that I had labeled "being practical." Like protecting myself from being used, which turns out to be no more than selfishness. And every once in a while, in a moment of honesty, I'll come across one of those dusty corners, and it's a bit like trying to swallow a peanut butter sandwich without any milk. It's hard to get down, and then you start to hiccup.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate Pentecost and recall the tremendous gift of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. At the Second Vatican Council in the Decree on the Church's Missionary Activity the fathers reminded us that "On the day of Pentecost, however, (the Holy Spirit) came down on the disciples that he might remain with them forever; on that day the Church was openly displayed to the crowds and the spread of the Gospel among the nations, through preaching, was begun." Our celebration today is an annual reminder that the spread of the Gospel message begun by the Apostles so long ago continues in and through the Church today. We must make it our mission to carry on this essential work of the Church.

This weekend at our 11:00am Mass, we celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation with two of our young people, Bella and Hope Finch who are being fully received into Church as they are Baptized, Confirmed and receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist for the first time. We assure them of our ongoing prayers as they enter the Church.

Although the official start of summer is still a few weeks away there is already a sense that things are slowing down a bit and families are planning opportunities to get away for some rest and relaxation therefore, I would like to share with you the words of our bishops as they wrote in their document *Follow the Way of Love: A Pastoral Message of the U.S. Catholic Bishops to Families*. "We are struck by the incredible busyness of family life that can take its toll on loving relationships. Daily we observe families overwhelmed by the demands of work, business travel, household tasks, getting to and from school, keeping appointments with doctors, civic responsibilities, and volunteering. Both men and women can get caught up in long hours and weekends at their place of work. Balancing home and work responsibilities is a shared obligation for spouses. It is a critical issue facing families today. Where choices exist, hours on the job need to be weighed against their impact on family life. To thrive, love requires attention, communication, and time—to share a story or confide a need, to play a game, to tell a joke, to watch and cheer on—time to be present to another's failure or success, confusion, despair or moment of decision. Spending time together builds intimacy, increases understanding and creates memories between husband and wife, parent and child, brothers and sisters, grandparents and younger family members. It is hard to imagine how a family can live faithfully, be life giving, and grow in mutuality without deliberately choosing to spend time together. It is especially important for couples to have some time alone. Spending time away from children and other adults provides opportunities to grow in understanding and rekindles the fire of love that is often left unattended as children, job, and other commitments claim time and energy."

Glad Tidings

Pentecost marks the end of the Easter season. This is the one feast of the Church's year when we focus on the third person of the Trinity, God the Holy Spirit. This is a good day to recall what Jesus said about himself, quoting the prophet Isaiah (61:1):

**The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me,
because the LORD has anointed me;
He has sent me to bring glad tidings to the
lowly, to heal the brokenhearted,
To proclaim liberty to the captives
and release to the prisoners,
To announce a year of favor from the LORD
and a day of vindication by our God.**

The Holy Spirit descended on Jesus at his baptism. This same Spirit, who also came upon the disciples at Pentecost, the birthday of the church, is the Spirit who hovered over the waters of our baptism, as we were anointed with the holy oil of salvation. The Spirit came upon us with renewed strength in confirmation, as we were anointed as followers of Christ. It is the Holy Spirit who calls us anew to the challenges of each day, inspiring and strengthening us to live as disciples and friends of Jesus. That does not mean the path is made easy, or that we will always be understood, accepted, and successful. It does mean that if we trust the Spirit and its promptings deep within us, we will always speak and act with faith and truth. It is not up to us to worry about whether people receive what we offer. Our words or deeds may be just one small seed sown in someone's soul; our job is to sow it and to entrust to the Holy Spirit the nurturing and nourishing of that seed. The Spirit of the Lord God is upon us, so share the glad tidings!

Gifts Of The Holy Spirit

So What Exactly Do We Receive When We Receive The Gifts of the Holy Spirit?

Wisdom - Through wisdom, the wonders of nature, every event in history, and all the ups and downs of our life take on deeper meaning and purpose. The wise person sees where the Spirit of God is at work and is able to share that insight with others. Wisdom is the fullest expression of the gifts of knowledge and understanding.

Understanding - The gift of understanding is the ability to comprehend how a person must live her or his life as a follower of Jesus. Through the gift of understanding, Christians realize that the Gospel tells them not just who Jesus is; it also tells them who we are. The gift of understanding is closely related to the gifts of knowledge and wisdom. .

Counsel - The gift of counsel, also translated as "right judgement", is the ability to know the difference between right and wrong and then to choose what is good. It helps us to act on and live out what Jesus has taught. In the exercise of right judgment, many of the other gifts - especially understanding, wisdom, and often courage - come into play in the Christian's daily life.

Fortitude - The gift of fortitude, can also be translated as "courage", enables us to take risks and to overcome fear as we try to live out the Gospel of Jesus. Followers of Jesus confront many challenges and even danger - the risk of being laughed at, the fear of rejection, and, for some believers, the fear of physical harm and even death. The Spirit gives Christians the strength to confront and ultimately overcome such challenges.

Knowledge - The gift of knowledge is the ability to comprehend the basic meaning and message of Jesus. Jesus revealed the will of God, his Father, and taught people what they need to know to achieve fullness of life and, ultimately, salvation. The gift of knowledge is closely related to the gifts of understanding and wisdom.

Piety - Sometimes called Reverence, the gift of piety gives the Christian a deep sense of respect for God. Jesus spoke of his Father, God, as "Abba," a very intimate name similar to "daddy" or "papa." Through the gift of reverence, we can come before God with the openness and trust of small children, totally dependent on the One who created us.

Fear of the Lord - The gift of Fear of the Lord is sometimes translated as "**Wonder and Awe.**" Though we can approach God with the trust of little children, we are also often aware of God's total majesty, unlimited power, and desire for justice. A child may want to sit on the lap of his loving Father, but sometimes the believer will fall on her knees in the presence of the Creator of the universe.
