A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

In today's Gospel, Mark says that the invitation to journey to a new and different shore comes from Jesus. He is the one who suggests, "Let us cross to the other side" (Mark 4:35). Yet that invitation comes as evening draws on, as so often happens in life. It comes amid the shadows of life where clarity of action is seldom sharp or distinct. Then to step into the boat is indeed an act of faith. Who would ever choose a crossing at such a time? Yet it was "as evening drew on" that Jesus said to his disciples, "Let us cross to the other side." And so they go.

It is at this point that they take Jesus into their boat, which is always what is expected of the disciple—that the Lord be invited on the journey, and that the journey to the other side be made together. The Jesus story ends in calm and stillness, but that is not its promise. What is assured is that faith can bring one to the other side, which is also the assurance given to Job out of the storm—that it is God who made the thick darkness and put limits on the sea, all along knowing its ability to burst forth. It is God who knows creation and is in control, it is Jesus who knows the human journey and accompanies us, and it is faith that sustains us in the midst of storms.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend our parish in union with Catholic parishes throughout the world will be participating in the annual Peter's Pence collection. Embarking on the eleventh year of his pontificate, Pope Francis continues to call each of us to be a witness of charity. "To love God and neighbor is not something abstract," he said, "but profoundly concrete: it means seeing in every person the face of the Lord to be served, to serve him concretely." Pope Francis shows through his actions what it means to serve our brothers and sisters and give them the love of Christ. Let us follow his example of service so that all people might have the joy of receiving Jesus through our presence: "And you are, dear brothers and sisters, the face of Jesus." The Peter's Pence Collection unites us in solidarity with the Holy Father and his works of charity toward those who are suffering around the world. Pope Francis reminds us that true power lies not in amassing possessions and resources for ourselves but in giving. "We must never forget that true power, at any level, is service, whose bright summit is upon the Cross. It means to enter into Jesus' logic, who bends down to wash the feet of the Apostles," he said. Your contributions to the Peter's Pence Collection join with the power of Christ and allow our Holy Father to support victims of war and natural disasters and all our brothers and sisters who face the greatest need.

On Saturday of this week the Church celebrates the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul. Therefore, I would like to share with you a brief passage from a homily by Benedict XVI: The Feast of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul is at the same time a grateful memorial of the great witnesses of Jesus Christ and a solemn confession for the Church: *one, holy, catholic and apostolic*. It is first and foremost a feast of *catholicity*. The sign of Pentecost - the new community that speaks all languages and unites all peoples into one people, in one family of God - this sign has become a reality. Our liturgical assembly, at which Bishops are gathered from all parts of the world, people of many cultures and nations, is an image of the family of the Church distributed throughout the earth. Strangers have become friends; crossing every border, we recognize one another as brothers and sisters. This brings to fulfillment the mission of St. Paul, who knew that he was the "minister of Christ Jesus among the Gentiles, with the priestly duty of preaching the Gospel of God so that the Gentiles [might] be offered up as a pleasing sacrifice, consecrated by the Holy Spirit" (Rom 15: 16). The purpose of the mission is that humanity itself becomes a living glorification of God, the true worship that God expects: this is the deepest meaning of *catholicity* - a *catholicity* that has already been given to us, towards which we must constantly start out again. *Catholicity* does not only express a horizontal dimension, the gathering of many people in unity, but also a vertical dimension: it is only by raising our eyes to God, by opening ourselves to him that we can truly become one.

Like Paul, Peter also came to Rome, to the city that was a center where all the nations converged and, for this very reason, could become, before any other, the expression of the universal outreach of the Gospel. As he started out on his journey from Jerusalem to Rome, he must certainly have felt guided by the voices of the prophets, by faith and by the prayer of Israel.

Making Amends

Aki Ra was no more than a toddler when he was conscripted by Cambodia's murderous Khmer Rouge régime to be a child soldier. At age five, instead of reciting the alphabet, he learned to plant deadly land mines. He had no choice in the matter, he said. The child soldiers had bags full of landmines on their backs, which they threw behind them as they walked. If anyone was too slow he was shot. After the Vietnamese army liberated Cambodia, the now teenaged Aki Ra was finally set free. Yet because of the work he and other child soldiers had done for the Khmer Rouge, Cambodia was strewn with thousands of active landmines, killing and maiming hundreds of people every year. Ra deeply regretted what he had done, and vowed to spend his life in restitution. He knew where he had buried many of the mines and how to disarm them safely. Armed only with a metal detector and a few simple tools, he began locating land mines and deactivating them one by one. Filled with TNT, a mine can detonate at any second, but Ra has never been injured in his work. For more than twenty years, he has continued this painstaking and dangerous work, and has also led safety education programs in villages. In 1999 he founded the Cambodia Landmine Museum, a non-profit group that provides education and resources concerning the country's land mines and allows visitors to view hundreds of disabled mines. The museum also serves as Ra's home, where he cares for more than twenty children who have been injured or disabled by these terrible weapons. Ra, now a widower, describes it as a place of healing for bodies, minds, and hearts, a place where love, support, and education will help secure a better future for the children who live there.

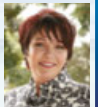
