The Rejection at Nazareth

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

God describes the people to whom Ezekiel is being sent as "hard of face and obstinate of heart" (Ezekiel 2:4). They are a people who have rebelled and revolted against God, but still God persists in sending them a prophet: this time Ezekiel, last time Jeremiah, the time before that Isaiah, all the way back to Samuel and Nathan, Elijah and Elisha. Even today, God continues to send prophets to soften our faces and make yielding our own hearts.

Jesus found hardened faces and stubborn hearts when he went to his hometown. Impenetrable seems to be the best description. His words could not get through. He was proclaiming the kingdom of God, the presence of God among them, and they couldn't hear him. It all depended on what they saw and all they saw was the carpenter, questioning where he got such wisdom and how he did these mighty deeds. He was just the son of Mary! We know the family. Go figure.

And then we hear some of the saddest words in the Gospel: "So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them" (Mark 6:5). Why? Their lack of faith.

So Jesus started a new family. It began with the people whom we have been hearing about—the disciples, for all their struggles to believe in him right up to the very end, but also people like the woman with the hemorrhage, Jairus and his daughter, the man lowered through the roof, the fellow who had an evil spirit. The list goes on and on, down to our own day.

By baptism, we became part of the family, the new family whose bond is not based on blood, but on faith. The ever -recurring question is: Is he able to work any signs among us, or is he amazed at our lack of faith?

Dear Parishioners,

Week after week we come to church and, if your family is like mine, sit in the same pew but how much attention do we really pay to the structure and art in our Church? If vou were to close vour eves could vou name which saints are represented in the stained glass windows, or how many statues there are in the Church? Have you ever taken time to look closely at the tabernacle? Catholic Church art and architecture have ancient traditions and so I offer for your reflection a brief passage from the Second Vatican Council's document Sacrosanctun Concilium in which the council fathers spoke about the place of art in our worship. "In fact, the Church has, with good reason, always reserved to herself the right to pass judgment upon the arts, deciding which of the works of artists are in accordance with faith, piety, and cherished traditional laws, and thereby fitted for sacred use. The Church has been particularly careful to see that sacred furnishings should worthily and beautifully serve the dignity of worship, and has admitted changes in materials, style, or ornamentation prompted by the progress of the technical arts with the passage of time....The Church has not adopted any particular style of art as her very own; she has admitted styles from every period according to the natural talents and circumstances of peoples, and the needs of the various rites. Thus, in the course of the centuries, she has brought into being a treasury of art which must be very carefully preserved. The art of our own days, coming from every race and region, shall also be given free scope in the Church, provided that it adorns the sacred buildings and holy rites with due reverence and honor; thereby it is enabled to contribute its own voice to that wonderful chorus of praise in honor of the Catholic faith sung by great men in times gone by. Ordinaries, by the encouragement and favor they show to art which is truly sacred, should strive after noble beauty rather than mere sumptuous display. This principle is to apply also in the matter of sacred vestments and ornaments. Let bishops carefully remove from the house of God and from other sacred places those works of artists which are repugnant to faith, morals, and Christian piety, and which offend true religious sense either by depraved forms or by lack of artistic worth, mediocrity and pretense. And when churches are to be built, let great care be taken that they be suitable for the celebration of liturgical services and for the active participation of the faithful. The practice of placing sacred images in churches so that they may be venerated by the faithful is to be maintained. Nevertheless their number should be moderate and their relative positions should reflect right order. For otherwise they may create confusion among the Christian people and foster devotion of doubtful orthodoxy.

I am proud of the fact that our parish staff works hard to provide the best possible service for our parishioners. However, this task is almost impossible if we do not know who you are. We currently list over 1400 households as registered members of our parish but recognize that many more families celebrate with us on a regular basis. Simply fill this out and place it in the Sunday collection basket and our parish staff will gladly mail a registration form out to you. This simple process only takes a few moments and is of tremendous benefit. First and foremost. registration enables our parish staff to more easily address your needs and concerns. Secondly, registered members have priority when it comes to preparation and celebration of the sacraments such as baptisms and marriages and enrollment at the School of the Madeline (yes, membership has its privileges). Finally, parish staffing (including clergy) and budgeting is based, in part, on the number of registered parishioners and so the more accurate count we have the better we, and the diocese, will be able to plan for the needs of our community. Once again, if you have not already done so I would like to invite you to go ahead and register. Also, if you are not sure if you are a registered member or not or if it has been many years since you registered with us, it does not hurt to fill out a new form in order that we may be certain to have the most recent information


