Some time after this, Jesus crossed to the far shore of the Sea of Galilee (that is, the Sea of Tiberias), and a great crowd of people followed him because they saw the signs he had performed by healing the sick. Then Jesus went up on a mountainside and sat down with his disciples. The Jewish Passover Festival was near.

When Jesus looked up and saw a great crowd coming toward him, he said to Philip, "Where shall we buy bread for these people to eat?" He asked this only to test him, for he already had in mind what he was going to do.

Philip answered him, "It would take more than half a year's wages to buy enough bread for each one to have a bite!"

Another of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, spoke up, "Here is a boy with five small barley loaves and two small fish, but how far will they go among so many?"

Jesus said, "Have the people sit down." There was plenty of grass in that place, and they sat down (about five thousand men were there). Jesus then took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted. He did the same with the fish.

When they had all had enough to eat, he said to his disciples, "Gather the pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted." So they gathered them and filled twelve baskets with the pieces of the five barley loaves left over by those who had eaten.

After the people saw the sign Jesus performed, they began to say, "Surely this is the Prophet who is to come into the world." Jesus, knowing that they intended to come and make him king by force, withdrew again to a mountain by himself. (John 6:1-15)

A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

In many homes, meals begin with grace and end with putting away the leftover food. Those leftovers are either eaten later by someone who missed dinner or added to tomorrow's meals. The meal in today's Gospel is somewhat similar. Before the meal Jesus "gave thanks." After all had eaten he asked that the leftovers be gathered "so that nothing will be wasted" (John 6:11, 12).

It's not a stretch to see the similarity to our Liturgy of the Eucharist, which begins with a prayer of thanksgiving. It ends with the remaining Eucharist being reserved for those who couldn't be present and the "crowd" being sent to share Christ's sacrificial love. It's miraculous enough that all who are present can eat and have their fill. That is something to be truly grateful for. Yet, the miracle extends beyond the table. "The hand of the Lord feeds us" (cf. Psalm 145:16) with leftover love to spare. The abundant "leftovers" are meant not to be wasted, but to be shared with all those in need of Christ's love.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

I would like to thank Fr. Al for his ministry here at St. Mary Magdalene. He has returned to his home, the Diocese of Philadelphia where he can be closer to family and his brother priests of the Diocese of Philadelphia.

This weekend, we as a parish, welcome Msgr. Eliseo Napiere, M.S.P. of the Mission Society of the Philippines to share with us the good work being accomplished by missionaries throughout the world.

In keeping with this visit I would like to share parts of Pope Francis 2014 Message for World Mission Sunday. The Holy Father wrote: Today vast numbers of people still do not know Jesus Christ. For this reason, the mission *ad gentes* continues to be most urgent. All the members of the Church are called to participate in this mission, for the Church is missionary by her very nature: she was born "to go forth". World Mission Day is a privileged moment when the faithful of various continents engage in prayer and concrete gestures of solidarity in support of the young Churches in mission lands. It is a celebration of grace and joy. A celebration of grace, because the Holy Spirit, sent by the Father, offers wisdom and strength to those who are obedient to his action. A celebration of joy, because Jesus Christ, the Father's Son, sent to evangelize the world, supports and accompanies our missionary efforts. This joy of Jesus and missionary disciples leads me to propose a biblical icon, which we find in the Gospel of Luke (cf. 10:21-23). The Evangelist tells us that the Lord sent the seventy-two disciples, two by two, into cities and villages to proclaim that the Kingdom of God was near, and to prepare people to meet Jesus. After carrying out this mission of preaching, the disciples returned full of joy: joy is a dominant theme of this first and unforgettable missionary experience. Yet the divine Master told them: "Do not rejoice because the demons are subject to you; but rejoice because your names are written in heaven. At that very moment Jesus rejoiced in the Holy Spirit and said: 'I give you praise, Father...' And, turning to the disciples in private he said, 'Blessed are the eyes that see what you see'" *Lk* 10:20-21, 23). Luke presents three scenes. Jesus speaks first to his disciples, then to the Father, and then again to the disciples. Jesus wanted to let the disciples share his joy, different and greater than anything they had previously experienced. "God loves a cheerful giver" (*2 Cor* 9:7). World Mission Day is also an occasion to rekindle the desire and the moral obligation to take joyful part in the mission *ad gentes*. A monetary contribution on the part of individuals is the sign of a self-offering, first to the Lord and then to others; in this way a material offering can become a means for the evangelization of humanity built on love....Dear brothers and sisters, on this World Mission Day my thoughts turn to all the local Churches. Let us not be robbed of the joy of evangelization!

I invite you to immerse yourself in the joy of the Gospel and nurture a love that can light up your vocation and your mission. I urge each of you to recall, as if you were making an interior pilgrimage, that "first love" with which the Lord Jesus Christ warmed your heart, not for the sake of nostalgia but in order to persevere in joy. The Lord's disciples persevere in joy when they sense his presence, do his will and share with others their faith, hope and evangelical charity. Let us pray through the intercession of Mary, the model of humble and joyful evangelization, that the Church may become a welcoming home, a mother for all peoples and the source of rebirth for our world.

STEWARDSHIP

Bread of Heaven

Jesus' feeding of a huge crowd in today's Gospel is prefigured in the story of the prophet Elisha in the first reading. The land has been stricken with famine. Elisha believes that God will provide, and when Elisha is given twenty barley loaves and some grain he refuses to take any for himself and offers it to a small crowd. Everyone eats and some is left over. Jesus, we are told, feeds thousands of hungry people with just five small loaves and two fish. The crowd is famished, not just for ordinary food, but also for God's salvation. The Evangelist tells us that everyone ate their fill, and when the disciples gathered up the leftovers they filled twelve baskets. This is the only one of Jesus' miracles described by all four Gospel writers. The actions of Jesus in taking the bread, giving thanks, blessing the bread, and distributing it remind us of what we share at every celebration of Mass. Jesus' actions are reflected in the actions of the priest as we are fed the bread of life to strengthen us on our daily journey. Elisha trusted that God would provide, and God did. When Jesus multiplied the loaves and fishes, God provided not just enough, but overflowing abundance. And in the Eucharist, Christ gives himself as food, totally and completely. If God feeds us beyond all our expectations, then we in turn must feed other people. Feeding people as they come to our parish creates an atmosphere of welcome. Feeding poor people helps them stop worrying where their next meal will come from. Feeding those in the crisis of natural disaster keeps them alive. Feeding people is God's work, and it is our work, too.

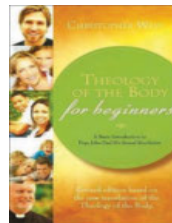
